A. 1. Title and purpose of the Programme

Title: ECOA_BURN multi-country Clean Cooking Programme (GS10789)

Purpose: The Programme of Activities (PoA) 'ECOA_BURN multi-country Clean Cooking Programme' will deploy highly efficient improved cookstoves reducing woody biomass consumption for households, institutions and Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) across different countries in Africa (see Table 1 in section A.2. with the list of countries being envisaged to be included under the PoA). It is possible that the PoA will be expanded to other countries beyond the ones listed under Table 1.

The PoA may opt later on to include technologies and/or practices that displace non-renewable by renewable fuels or for the introduction of safe water supply and treatment technologies.

The Coordinating and Managing Entity (CME) of the PoA is 'BURN Manufacturing Co.' (in the following 'BURN'), a US based company. The PoA will be certified with the Gold Standard applying the Gold Standard methodology 'Technologies and Practices to Displace Decentralized Thermal Energy Consumption' (TPDDTEC).

The proposed project activities under the PoA will be implemented by 'BURN ' or any other project implementing partners.

The first project activities under the PoA will distribute highly efficient improved firewood and/or charcoal stoves to households in Somalia and Kenya.

Project activities under the PoA may accommodate different stove types manufactured by BURN or other manufacturers and target besides households as well SMEs or institutions (e.g. schools, prisons, hospitals, restaurants etc).

BURN is the largest fuel-efficient appliance manufacturer in Africa and produces all its stoves in Sub-Saharan first and only modern cookstove manufacturing facility in Kenya.

In developing countries, including most of the countries on the African continent cooking is done on either 3-stone fires or very inefficient traditional cookstoves, consuming a lot of fuel, in particular non-renewable firewood and charcoal.¹ The high biomass

consumption has negative impacts on the environment leading to deforestation and land degradation, Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG) emissions, loss of soil fertility and soils' reduced ability of water retention. Further, indoor air pollution through health-damaging pollutants while combusting firewood and charcoal result in diseases like e.g. pneumonia, stroke, ischaemic heart diseases, chronic obstructive pulmonary diseases and lung cancer.

A. 2. Geographic boundary of the Programme

Activities under the PoA are envisaged to be located in any of the countries listed in the following Table. The geographic boundary of the programme consists of the borders of any of those countries.

The start date of the PoA is 01/07/2019, the date of the project start date of VPA1 (located in Somalia). Since the project start date of 1st VPA, being 1 year prior to submission of documents to GS preliminary review, is earlier than the date of first submission of the PoA.

A. 4. Programme eligibility under the Gold Standard for Global Goals

Type of Project: Projects under the programme will deploy improved cookstoves reducing fuel consumption for households, institutions and SMEs across the territories of the countries indicated in Table 1. The projects will always include physical action/implementation on the ground. Since projects under the programme fall under the approved 'Community Services Activity Requirements', they are automatically eligible for GS certification (see Principles & Requirements, 4 (a) 4.1.3.).

Location of Project: Projects under the programme will be located in one of the countries indicated in Table 1. All of the countries have ratified the Kyoto protocol and are listed as non-Annex I countries and do not have a mandatory cap on their GHG emissions. Other countries may be included later on to the PoA.

Project Area, Project Boundary and Scale: Projects under the programme will be located in one of the countries indicated in Table 1. Other countries may be included later on to the PoA. The projects will be certified as GS projects and will not be included in any other voluntary or compliance standards programme. There will not be any double counting of impacts at design and performance certification. The programme will apply the Gold Standard methodology 'Technologies and Practices to Displace Decentralized Thermal Energy Consumption' (TPDDTEC), and there will be no aggregated micro-scale or small-scale threshold. Hence, the VPAs are of large scale.

Host Country Requirements: Projects will be in compliance with applicable Host Country's legal, environmental, ecological and social regulations.

Contact Details: Details of the project developer organisation including legal registration details have been provided at the time of opening the GS account.

Legal ownership: It will be demonstrated for each project activity that ownership of any products that are generated under GS certification (e.g. carbon credits) will be transferred from project beneficiaries (users of improved cookstoves) to the project developer.

Other rights: This is expected not to be applicable to the programme and its project activities. If however for some reason it becomes applicable, project developer will

demonstrate uncontested legal rights and/or permissions concerning changes in use of other resources required to service the project.

Official Development Assistance (ODA) declaration: The project developer will ensure to submit the ODA declaration for each project activity at the time of Design Certification.

Eligibility Principles and Requirements: Projects under this programme will ensure to contribute to the Vision and Mission of the Gold standard and follow the Eligibility Principles and Requirements as outlined in section 4 of the 'Principles & Requirements' and in the 'Community Services Activity Requirements'

A. 5. Current status of the Programme

The PoA Design Consultation was conducted between 19/05/2020 to 19/06/2020. The PoA-DD and the first three VPA-DDs (VPA1, VPA2 and VPA3) have been submitted along with this PoA Design Consultation Report for GS preliminary review. The local stakeholder consultation for these VPAs is envisaged to be conducted once the COVID-19 situation eases. This is in line with the GS COVID-19: Interim Measures. In case that additional host countries beyond the ones mentioned under Table 1 will be included in future, additional design consultations would be conducted.

SECTION B. DESIGN OF STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION PROCESS

B.1. Description of the consultation methods

The stakeholder consultation is conducted both at the PoA (programme level consultation) and VPA level (activity level consultation). VPA level consultation will be carried out either for each VPA or a group of VPAs. This document includes the description of the programme level consultation, the activity level consultations will be described in the relevant Local Stakeholder Consultation reports.

The PoA level design consultation was conducted to obtain feedback from relevant national and local authorities, NGO communities, and other stakeholders on the design framework of the programme.

The consultation process was made on-line. Invitations for the consultation were sent via email on May 19, 2020 (see screenshots S-1, S-2 and S-3) with the Non-Technical Summary of the PoA³ and the Feedback Form⁴ attached. The invitation emails and the consultation material (Non-technical summary of the PoA and Feedback Form) were provided in English, Portuguese and French.

The stakeholders were given 30 days for submitting any comments or feedback.⁵ The stakeholders were also encouraged to share the consultation opportunity with other organizations or individuals that could be interested in participating.

An additional reminder Email was sent 3 weeks after the first invitation email to all the stakeholders (see screenshots S-4, S-5 and S-6). Stakeholders proposed by the feedback given by that date and who were not invited before, were additionally invited when sending out the reminder Emails. In addition, the invitation for the PoA Design Consultation was published on the web-page of the CME (<https://burnstoves.com>) (see screenshot S-7). All the received feedback was obtained via mail or via the Feedback Forms which were sent via mail⁶.

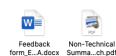



NON-TECHNICAL SUMMARY "ECOА_BURN multi-country Clean Cooking Programme"

Introduction

In most of the countries on the African continent cooking is done on either 3-stone fires or very inefficient traditional cookstoves, consuming a lot of fuel, in particular non-renewable firewood and charcoal.⁸ The high biomass consumption has negative impacts on the environment leading to deforestation and land degradation, Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG) emissions, loss of soil fertility and soils' reduced ability of water retention. Further, indoor air pollution through health-damaging pollutants while combusting firewood and charcoal result in diseases like e.g. pneumonia, stroke, ischaemic heart diseases, chronic obstructive pulmonary diseases and lung cancer.

Purpose and technology of the Programme of Activities (PoA)

The Programme of Activities (PoA) 'ECOА_BURN multi-country Clean Cooking Programme' will deploy highly efficient improved cookstoves reducing woody biomass consumption for households, institutions and Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) across different countries in Africa (see Table 1 with the list of countries being envisaged to be included under the PoA). It is possible that the PoA will be expanded to other countries beyond the ones listed under Table 1.

The PoA may opt later on to include technologies and/or practices that displace non-renewable by renewable fuels or for the introduction of safe water supply and treatment technologies.

The Coordinating and Managing Entity (CME) of the PoA is 'BURN Manufacturing Co.' (in the following 'BURN'), a US based company. The PoA will be certified with the Gold Standard applying the Gold Standard methodology 'Technologies and Practices to Displace Decentralized Thermal Energy Consumption' (TPDDTEC).

The proposed project activities under the PoA will be implemented by 'BURN ' or any other project implementing partners. The first project activities under the PoA will distribute highly efficient improved firewood and/or charcoal stoves to households in Somalia and Kenya.

Project activities under the PoA may accommodate different stove types manufactured by BURN or other manufacturers and target besides households as well SMEs or institutions (e.g. schools, prisons, hospitals, restaurants etc).

BURN is the largest fuel-efficient appliance manufacturer in Africa and produces all its stoves in Sub-Saharan first and only modern cookstove manufacturing facility in Kenya.





Carbon credits

Greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reductions achieved through saving of non-renewable biomass will result in carbon credits following GS certification rules and procedures.

The revenues from the sale of carbon credits help amongst others to

- distribute improved cookstoves to a subsidized price affordable for end-users;
- scale up and expand the programme, thus reaching a wider range of end-users and generating more jobs;
- further invest in R&D, hence to produce high quality stoves at lower cost;
- provide a reliable after-sales service;
- sensitize and raise awareness amongst end-users about the benefits and how to use the improved cookstoves.

Contribution to Sustainable Development

Besides reducing GHG emission in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) number 13 'Climate Action'⁹, this programme will also seek to increase other long-term sustainability benefits for the local families, SMEs and institutions as well as the local environment. Project activities under the PoA are expected to contribute to different Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the following way:

- Reduction in end-user expenses related to the purchase of fuel for cooking (in line with SDG 1 'No Poverty').
- Time savings both for fuel procurement and cooking, thus more time is available¹⁰, for other tasks, like income generating activities or for growing food (in line with SDGs 1 'No Poverty', 2 'Zero Hunger' and 5 'Gender Equality').

Gold Standard®

- Less harmful carbon monoxide and particulate matter during combustion in households/SMEs/institutions will reduce indoor air pollution and thereby decrease of respiratory diseases, headache and itchy eyes, particularly for women and children who spend lot of their time in cooking activities (in line with SDG 3 'Good health and well-being' and 5 'Gender Equality').
- Improved cookstoves cook faster than traditional stoves and use less fuel, enabling children, particularly girls to dedicate more time for education/school instead of for cooking (in line with SDG 4 'Quality Education')
- Increased penetration of clean and reliable cooking technologies (in line with SDG 7 'Affordable and Clean Energy') and raising awareness of the related safety, economic, and environmental benefits (in line with SDG 4 'Quality Education').
- BURN produces its cookstoves in a manufacturing facility located in Kenya, thus generating hundreds of jobs on the African continent. Other jobs are created for sales, marketing, distribution and monitoring staff. Continuous training results in permanent knowledge transfer to local people. BURN may open in future additional factories or assembly lines across the continent depending on the demand (in line with SDGs 1 'No Poverty' and 8 'Decent Work and Economic Growth').
- Reduced deforestation and forest degradation in the areas where non-renewable biomass is used as a source of fuel. This will contribute to the overall stability of forest ecosystems which support biodiversity, watersheds and soil conditions (in line with SDG 15 'Life on Land').

Joining the PoA

Different organizations/entities may become project implementing partners. A contract between CME and project implementing partner will define all the arrangements between the Parties as well as the terms for joining the PoA. Different fee models are possible and are a matter of negotiation. CME may e.g. charge an inclusion and/or annual management fee or a certain proportion of the carbon credits or a combination of both.

Introdução

Na maioria dos países do continente africano, o cozimento é feito em fogueiras de três pedras ou em fogões tradicionais muito ineficientes, consumindo muito combustível, principalmente lenha e carvão vegetal não renováveis. O alto consumo de biomassa tem impactos negativos no meio ambiente, levando ao desmatamento e degradação da terra, emissões de gases de efeito estufa (GEE), perda de fertilidade do solo e capacidade reduzida de retenção de água no solo. Além disso, a poluição do ar dentro dos prédios através de poluentes prejudiciais à saúde durante a queima de lenha e carvão resulta em doenças como, por exemplo, pneumonia, acidente vascular cerebral, doenças cardíacas isquêmicas, doenças pulmonares obstrutivas crônicas e câncer de pulmão.

Objetivo e tecnologia do Programa de Atividades (PoA)

O Programa de Atividades (PoA) ‘ECO_A_BURN multi-country Clean Cooking Programme’ implementará fogões de cozinha aprimorados e altamente eficientes, reduzindo o consumo de biomassa para residências, instituições e Pequenas e Médias Empresas (PMEs) em diferentes países da África (consulte a Tabela 1 com a lista de países que se prevê incluir no PoA). É possível que o PoA seja expandido para outros países além dos listados na Tabela 1.

O PoA pode optar posteriormente por incluir tecnologias e/ou práticas que substituam os combustíveis não renováveis por combustíveis renováveis ou para a introdução de tecnologias seguras de abastecimento e tratamento de água.

A Entidade Coordenadora e de Gerenciamento (CME) do PoA é 'BURN Manufacturing Co.' (a seguir 'BURN'), uma empresa com sede nos EUA. O PoA será certificado com o Gold Standard aplicando a metodologia Gold Standard 'Technologies and Practices to Displace Decentralized Thermal Energy Consumption' (TPDDTEC).

As atividades do projeto propostas no âmbito do PoA serão implementadas por 'BURN' ou por qualquer outro parceiro de implementação.

As primeiras atividades do projeto sob o PoA distribuirão fogões a lenha e / ou carvão melhorados e altamente eficientes para as famílias da Somália e do Quênia.

Créditos de carbono

As reduções de emissão de gases de efeito estufa (GEE) obtidas com a economia de biomassa não renovável resultarão em créditos de carbono seguindo as regras e procedimentos da certificação GS.

As receitas da venda de créditos de carbono ajudam, entre outros, a

- a) distribuir fogões aprimorados a um preço subsidiado, acessível aos usuários finais;
- b) ampliar e expandir o programa, alcançando assim mais usuários finais e gerando mais empregos;
- c) investir ainda mais em pesquisa e desenvolvimento, daí produzir fogões de alta qualidade e baixo custo;
- d) fornecer um serviço pós-venda confiável;
- e) sensibilizar e conscientizar os usuários finais sobre os benefícios e como usar os fogões aprimorados.

Contribuição para o desenvolvimento sustentável

Além de reduzir as emissões de GEE, de acordo com o Objetivo de Desenvolvimento Sustentável das Nações Unidas (ODS), número 13 'Ação climática', este programa também procurará aumentar outros benefícios de sustentabilidade a longo prazo para as famílias, PMEs e instituições locais, bem como para o ambiente local. Espera-se que as atividades do projeto no âmbito do PoA contribuam para diferentes Objetivos de Desenvolvimento Sustentável (ODS) da seguinte maneira:

- Redução das despesas do usuário final relacionadas à compra de combustível para cozinhar (de acordo com o ODS 1 'Sem pobreza').
- Economia de tempo, tanto para compras de combustível quanto para cozinhar, portanto, há mais tempo disponível para outras tarefas, como atividades de geração de renda ou para o cultivo de alimentos (em conformidade com os ODS 1 'Sem Pobreza', 2 'Fome Zero' e 5 'Igualdade de Gênero')
- Menos monóxido de carbono e menos material particulado nocivos durante a combustão em residências / PMEs / instituições reduzirão a poluição do ar em ambientes internos e, assim, diminuirão as doenças respiratórias, dores de cabeça e coceira nos olhos, principalmente para mulheres e crianças que passam muito tempo em atividades culinárias (em linha com o ODS 3 'Boa saúde e bem-estar' e 5 'Igualdade de gênero').
- Os fogões aprimorados cozinham mais rápido que os fogões tradicionais e consomem menos combustível, permitindo que as crianças, principalmente as meninas, dediquem mais tempo à educação / escola, em vez de cozinhar (de acordo com o ODS 4 "Educação de qualidade")
- Maior introdução de tecnologias de cozinha limpas e confiáveis (de acordo com o ODS 7 'Energia acessível e limpa') e conscientizando sobre os benefícios de segurança, econômicos e ambientais relacionados (de acordo com o ODS 4 'Educação de qualidade').

- A BURN produz seus fogões em uma fábrica localizada no Quênia, gerando centenas de empregos no continente africano. Outros empregos são criados para a equipe de vendas, marketing, distribuição e monitoramento. O treinamento contínuo resulta em transferência permanente de conhecimento para as pessoas locais. A BURN pode abrir futuras fábricas ou linhas de montagem adicionais em todo o continente, dependendo da demanda (de acordo com os ODS 1 'Sem Pobreza' e 8 'Trabalho Decente e Crescimento Econômico').

-Redução do desmatamento e degradação florestal nas áreas onde a biomassa não renovável é usada como fonte de combustível. Isso contribuirá para a estabilidade geral dos ecossistemas florestais que apóiam a biodiversidade, as bacias hidrográficas e as condições do solo (em conformidade com o ODS 15 'Vida em Terra').

Dans la plupart des pays du continent africain, la cuisson se fait soit sur des feux à 3 pierres soit sur des foyers traditionnels très inefficaces, consommant beaucoup de combustible, en particulier du bois de chauffage non renouvelable et du charbon de bois. La consommation élevée de biomasse a des impacts négatifs sur l'environnement, entraînant la déforestation et

la dégradation des terres, les émissions de gaz à effet de serre (GES), la perte de fertilité des sols et la capacité réduite des sols à retenir l'eau. 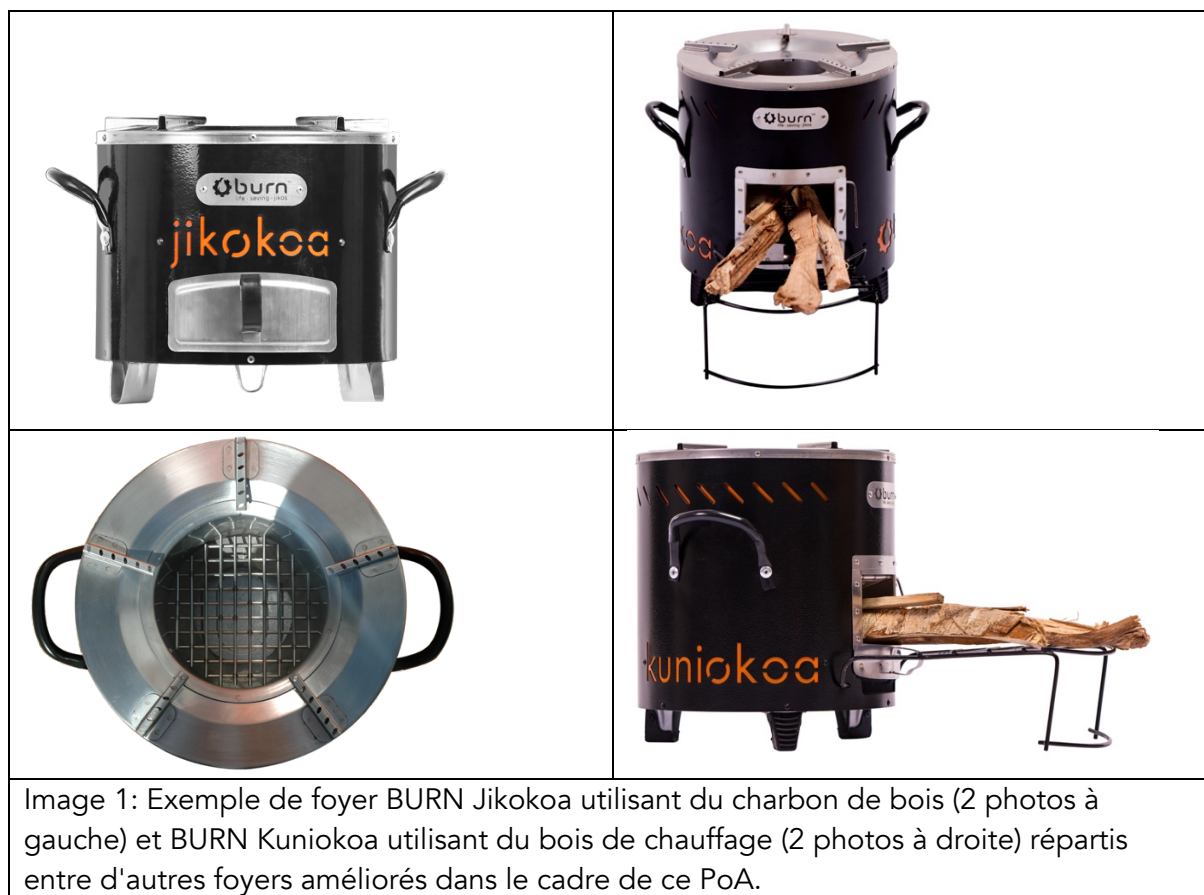

Les réductions d'émissions de gaz à effet de serre (GES) obtenues grâce à l'économie de biomasse non renouvelable se traduiront par des crédits de carbone conformément aux règles et procédures de certification GS.

Les revenus de la vente de crédits carbone aident entre autres à

- f) distribuer des foyers améliorés à un prix subventionné abordable pour les utilisateurs finaux;
- g) étendre le programme, atteignant ainsi plus d'utilisateurs finaux et générant plus d'emplois;
- h) investir davantage dans la recherche et développement, afin de produire des foyers de haute qualité à moindre coût;

Contribution au développement durable

- BURN produit ses foyers dans une usine de fabrication située au Kenya, générant ainsi des centaines d'emplois sur le continent africain. D'autres emplois sont créés pour le personnel de vente, marketing, distribution et suivi. La formation continue se traduit par un transfert permanent de connaissances vers les populations locales. B.4. Level of further consultations

The Feedback Form sent to the stakeholders included a following question regarding the consultation level: "According to your opinion, at which level should the Local Stakeholder Consultation (LSC) for different activities implemented under this Programme of Activities be carried out – a) At VPA level (i.e. conducting a LSC for each activity or for a group of activities if those are homogenous) as suggested by Gold Standard as the default approach OR at b) PoA (programme) level?"

The majority of stakeholders recommend the LSC to be conducted at a VPA level or a group of VPAs if those are homogenous. Since several countries will be included in the PoA, a PoA level stakeholder consultation would not make sense in the opinion of the CME. The received stakeholders feedback supports the decision of the CME to carry out the LSC at activity level for each VPA or groups of VPAs (provided that the VPAs are homogenous) which is the default approach as suggested by Gold Standard.

No significant synergies and conflicts with similar carbon programmes being implemented by other entities in overlapping geographical boundary are expected. Any project activities implemented under this given PoA will take into account the presence of other cookstove activities in the respective target areas when determining the baseline scenario.

The CME will confirm for each activity (VPA) registered under this PoA that there will be no double counting with any existing programme/project being implemented by other entities in overlapping geographical boundary. This will be done in line with the Gold Standard requirements via two ways. First of all, before inclusion of any new VPA under the PoA, it will be confirmed from the relevant online carbon project registries that the proposed activity is neither registered as a standalone project activity or as a part of a PoA with CDM, Gold Standard or other carbon standard. Secondly, each project stove will be identified with an unique identification number or other way which enables the unique identification of the devices to be part of the specific VPA.

Several stakeholders expressed their interest in cooperating with the CME. The CME is happy to explore about possible synergies and discuss about distribution partnerships as soon as an activity will be implemented in the country.
