### A.1. A non-technical summary of the project

#### NON-TECHNICAL SUMMARY

“GS10789 VPA1: Efficient and Clean Cooking for households in Somalia”

#### Introduction

In most of the countries on the African continent cooking is done on either 3-stone fires or very inefficient traditional cookstoves, consuming a lot of fuel, in particular non-renewable firewood and charcoal.<sup>1</sup> The high biomass consumption has negative impacts on the

environment leading to deforestation and land degradation, Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG) emissions, loss of soil fertility and soils' reduced ability of water retention. Further, indoor air pollution through health-damaging pollutants while combusting firewood and charcoal result in diseases like e.g. pneumonia, stroke, ischemic heart diseases, chronic obstructive pulmonary diseases and lung cancer.

**Purpose and technology of the voluntary project activity (VPA)**

The purpose of VPA 1 'Efficient and Clean Cooking for households in Somalia included under the Gold Standard Programme of Activities (PoA), 'ECO\_A\_BURN multi-country Clean Cooking Programme', is the dissemination of highly efficient improved charcoal cookstoves (ICS), known as 'Jikokoa' reducing woody biomass consumption for urban and peri-urban households in Somalia.

Several greenhouse gases (GHG), including carbon dioxide, are produced as a result of the incomplete combustion of biomass as used in cook stoves. More GHG emissions result from the use of biomass which is non-renewable. ICS improve heat transfer efficiency as compared to the baseline traditional cook stoves, thereby reducing both the amount of woody biomass used by unit appliance implemented and the emission of GHGs.

By using the ICS, the consumers assign and transfer all rights on the carbon credits to BURN Manufacturing Co., the Coordinating and Managing Entity of the PoA and at the same time VPA implementer.

ICS are distributed through direct sale/distribution and a variety of retail outlets across the country to end-users.

Target Group and Location

The target group of the VPA are urban and peri-urban households using non-renewable biomass (predominantly charcoal) with a conventional system with no improved combustion air supply or flue gas ventilation system, i.e. without a grate or a chimney, prior to receipt of an efficient cooking stove. The VPA will cover urban and peri-urban areas across the 6 federal member states and Banadir Regional Administration (BRA) of the Federal Republic of Somalia.

Technology

The VPA deploys an efficient cooking stove known as Jikokoa. The technology was designed and developed by BURN. The technology has a certified thermal efficiency of more than 50% and is intended for use with charcoal. The Jikokoa stove's design takes into account the local cooking culture in the project area to ensure that improvements in technology and improved standards of living do not come at the expense of cultural traditions. The VPA may opt to distribute other stove models over time.



Implementation plan

The project started on 01/07/2019 with the distribution of the first improved cookstoves. It is estimated that 250,000 ICS will have been distributed by the end of the first crediting period (July 2024).

**Carbon credits**

Greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reductions achieved through saving of non-renewable biomass will result in carbon credits following certification rules and procedures. The revenues from the sale of carbon credits help amongst others to

- a) distribute improved cookstoves to a subsidized price affordable for end-users;
- b) scale up and expand the programme, thus reaching a wider range of end-users and generating more jobs;
- c) further invest in R&D, hence to produce high quality stoves at lower cost;
- d) provide a reliable after-sales service;
- e) sensitize and raise awareness amongst end-users about the benefits and how to use the improved cookstoves.

**Contribution to Sustainable Development**

Besides reducing GHG emission in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) number 13 ‘Climate Action’<sup>2</sup>, this project will also seek to increase other long-term sustainability benefits for the local families as well as the local environment. Project activities under the PoA are expected to contribute to different Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the following way:

- Reduction in end-user expenses related to the purchase of fuel for cooking (in line with SDG 1 ‘No Poverty’), particularly for women and children who spend lot of their time in cooking activities (in line with SDG 3 ‘Good health and well-being’ and 5 ‘Gender Equality’).
- Increased penetration of clean and reliable cooking technologies (in line with SDG 7 ‘Affordable and Clean Energy’) and raising awareness of the related safety, economic, and environmental benefits (in line with SDG 4 ‘Quality Education’).
- BURN produces its cookstoves in a manufacturing facility located in Kenya, thus generating hundreds of jobs on the African continent. Other jobs are created for sales, marketing, distribution and monitoring staff in Somalia. Continuous training results in permanent knowledge transfer to local people. BURN may open in future additional factories or assembly lines across the continent depending on the demand (in line with SDGs 1 ‘No Poverty’ and 8 ‘Decent Work and Economic Growth’).
- Reduced deforestation and forest degradation in the areas where non-renewable biomass is used as a source of fuel. This will contribute to the overall stability of forest ecosystems which support biodiversity, watersheds and soil conditions (in line with SDG 15 ‘Life on Land’).

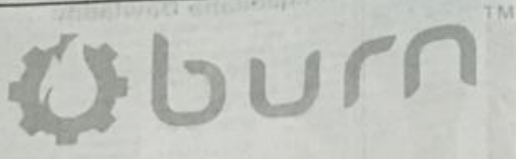

All the meetings were progressively translated in Somali to make sure all the attendees could understand the presentation and participate in the discussion. Questions and concerns raised by the participants were similar in the three meetings. Please refer to C.3. for a complete list of the questions raised during the meetings.

### Minutes of the physical meetings

#### Registration:

Participants arrived and were asked to sign the attendance list.

Participants attending through Zoom were asked to register online in order to access the meeting.

#### Welcome Remarks:

Participants in person were welcomed by BURN's local team leaders Mohammed Adam, Somali-Region manager, and Mohamed Hassan and Gulied Salaan Omar as well as BURN's carbon team, Johann Thaler and Lucie Millard, both participating through Zoom. The purpose of the meeting and the agenda were explained to the audience.

#### Project Presentation:

BURN's staff started the presentation by explaining the project in detail; they presented BURN Manufacturing, the main goals of the program and its benefits for the local communities, as well as the ICS technology involved in the project. They also took time to remind the stakeholders about climate change and its causes, and they briefly explained the theory of the carbon credits, carbon markets and the development of carbon projects.

#### Questions and answers session:

Stakeholders raised many questions about the implementation of the project, as well as on the product itself, and specifically on its price, its distribution, and the safety around its utilization. They were interested to know what the positive impacts of the projects on the local communities would be. Stakeholders also highlighted the importance of trying to implement solutions for preserving forests, developing activities around reforestation or renewable fuels. All these questions and comments were fully and satisfactorily answered by BURN.

#### Presentation of the Safeguarding Principles and Sustainability assessment of the project:

BURN's staff explained the project's Safeguarding Principles and their assessment. The stakeholders were continuously consulted for feedback and comments, as an open discussion. The meeting continued with a presentation of the SDGs, and on the positive impacts of the project on a few specific SDGs. Participants agreed with the assessment and did not have further comments. BURN's staff presented the grievance mechanism as well as how the sustainable development impacts will be monitored.

#### Closure of the meeting:

The evaluation forms were then distributed to the participants. The team expressed its appreciation to all participants who attended the meeting and who offered many constructive suggestions. The meeting closed with a cooking demonstration with the charcoal stove Jikoko.
