1	<p><b>The random sample is not representative</b></p> <p><u>Issue</u> From the names of the end-users interviewed by the VVB, it appears as if only two regions have so far implemented. The project proponent's random sample (96) and the VVBs interviewed acceptance sample does not represent the whole country.</p> <p>The MR does not indicate the implementation status, including the regions where the project has been implemented just the total number.</p> <p><u>Action Required</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The VVB must ensure that the project proponent clarifies the implementation status of the project specifically the region where the project has so far been implemented.</li> <li>2. The VVB must ensure that the selected sample represents the whole project area under Section 2.3 of the verification report.</li> </ol> <p><u>Program Rule(s)</u> VCS Monitoring Report Template, v4.2, Section 3.1 VCS Verification Report Template v4.1, Sections 2.3.</p>	<p><b>Round 1</b></p> <p><u>VVB Response</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MR section 3.1 have been revised in revised MR version 1.3 dated 03-May-2023 and it is clear that the distribution of cookstoves have happened in 6 provinces out of official 8 provinces in Kenya and Project database confirms the same as verified by the assessment team.</li> <li>• FVR have also been revised and location of all 11 samples interviewed was included in interviews section to give a clear idea that during site visit Central and Eastern provinces samples were assessed where the maximum cookstoves were distributed by PP (about 96%). The samples lying in these two regions were selected randomly through random number generator out of 48 samples selected by PP and they covered the maximum implementation area and same has been updated in section 2.3 and section 4.1 of FVR.</li> </ul> <p><u>Verra Response</u> The VVB has clarified that the cookstoves were distributed in 6 out of 8 provinces of Kenya (about 96%), and samples were randomly selected. The implementation status of the project has been updated to include the number of cookstoves per province. This finding is now closed, and no further response is required.</p>	Closed
