The aim of the stakeholder consultation is to engage affected stakeholders and to discuss potential environmental, social and economic impacts (both positive contributions and potential risks) that projects may have during design, planning and implementation and to establish an ongoing mechanism for feedback.

The local stakeholder consultation was held both virtually and physically. The virtual online meeting was held on 18<sup>th</sup> Jan 2022, whereas person to person meeting was held on 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> Dec 2021.

### **A.2. A non-technical summary of the project**

>>

This project will involve the distribution of ceramic water filters in Uganda as the planned target area for the project implementation. The project owner SPOUTS International will do the preparation and implementation of the project.

Most families in the area do not have access to clean drinking water while others use the traditional three-stone cooking stove to boil enough water for their households which

consume large amounts of firewood. This means that a lot of time is spent collecting firewood that could be otherwise used for other developmental activities. For the boiling households, the large quantities of firewood required for three-stone fires put a lot of pressure on the protected forests in Uganda. Traditional stoves also produce a lot of smoke which causes respiratory disease, particularly in women/girls who use them for cooking, but also in young children and other people (e.g., the elderly) who spend a lot of time indoors. Using such an inefficient cooking method also has unintentional negative impacts on the environment surrounding the local people.

The water filter distributed is the Purifaaya Ceramic Water Filter, which on average filters 4 litres of drinking water every hour and the water doesn't require any further treatment thereafter. This is extensively covered in our training. It also provides storage of 10 to 20 litres of filtered water ensuring a full-day supply of drinking water for the whole household. This greatly reduces daily firewood/charcoal costs and alleviates illness caused by drinking untreated water. The ceramic water filter is manufactured locally by local producers, using locally sourced raw materials. Examples of the ceramic water filters is shown in the picture below:



In addition to reducing Greenhouse Gas emissions, contributing to the mitigation of climate change, and improving health, this project provides local benefits to communities:

- Reduced pressure on protected forests in Uganda, deforestation and degradation of surrounding forests, as less wood will be needed, just to prepare home meals, not drinking water;
- Reduced soil erosion and nutrient loss as trees protect the land;
- Reduced risk of flooding in hilly areas as trees and plants on slopes soak up the rain;
- Reduced poverty, as there a reduction on annual expenditure on cooking fuel;
- Provision of employment opportunities to the locals who are employed at the factory, offices and field projects;
- Reduced adverse health effects associated with drinking untreated water and smoke inhalation; and
- Reduced cooking and wood collection time, which will allow more time to be spent on other important household tasks and/or supervising children.

### **A.4. Summary of economic, social, and environmental impacts of the Project**

>>

Potential negative impacts that could take place were considered and are considered in the design of the Project.

- The Project shall not discriminate with regard to participation and inclusion.
  - The Project is open for all households which previously boiled water a method to make water safe for consumption and also those that have completely no access to clean and safe drinking water. The water filters are presented to the public and any household can acquire one either purchase

- a very subsidized cost or receive one through outreaches.
- The Project shall not discriminate with regards to equal treatment, or lead to adverse impact on gender equality or the situation of women.
    - Both women and men will benefit from the Project activities, no group is excluded from participating in the Project activities.
    - By ensuring both women's and men's representation at the LOCAL STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION, the Project takes into account the ability of both women and men to participate in the Project.
    - The Project reduces the need for women to leave their homes to seek firewood. This leads to a reduced risk of gender-based violence.
    - The Project will increase the control of resources by reducing wood consumption through reduced use of firewood to boil drinking water.
    - Due to less need for the collection of firewood and time spent on boiling water, more time will be available for income-generating activities, child care or education.
  - The Project shall not increase health risks.
    - The Project reduces health risks associated with drinking untreated water by providing a consistent source of drinking water.
    - The Project reduces health risks through the improvement of indoor air pollution.
  - The Project shall not cause negative economic consequences during and after Project implementation.
    - There are positive economic impacts, during and after the Project, as the water filter will be produced locally, using local resources. For the implementation of the Project as well as maintenance, local people will be hired, which provides additional work opportunities. This leads to knowledge transfer in the Project area.
  - Will the Project increase greenhouse gas emissions over the Baseline Scenario?
    - Greenhouse Gas emissions will be reduced as the water from the ceramic water filter doesn't require extra treatment like boiling using firewood.

The Project will positively contribute to the following 3 SDGs:

- SDG 6 – Clean Water and Sanitation
  - Through the use of the Purifaaya, households have access to clean and safe drinking water. This means the risk of waterborne illnesses has been reduced.
- SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production
  - Through the use of the water filters, households are spending less on purchasing fuel, only buying that for making food. More money is saved and invested into education for children, and other businesses to generate more income for the family
  - Through the production of the water filters, employment opportunities have been created and locals' standards of living are improved by earning salaries at SPOUTS.
- SDG 13 – Climate Action
  - Through the dissemination of water filters, there's no need for households to continue boiling drinking water. This means less wood will be consumed, which leads to a reduction of GHG emissions, contributing to SDG 13.

Less wood needed to only prepare meals in the households will also positively lead to:

- Reduced pressure on the Forests in Uganda;
- Reduced soil erosion and nutrient loss as trees protect the land;
- Reduced risk of flooding in hilly areas as trees and plants on slopes soak up rain.

Messages for calls were prepared for local authorities and their communities and, other local representatives not reachable by email, often communication delivered by in person depending on the situation.

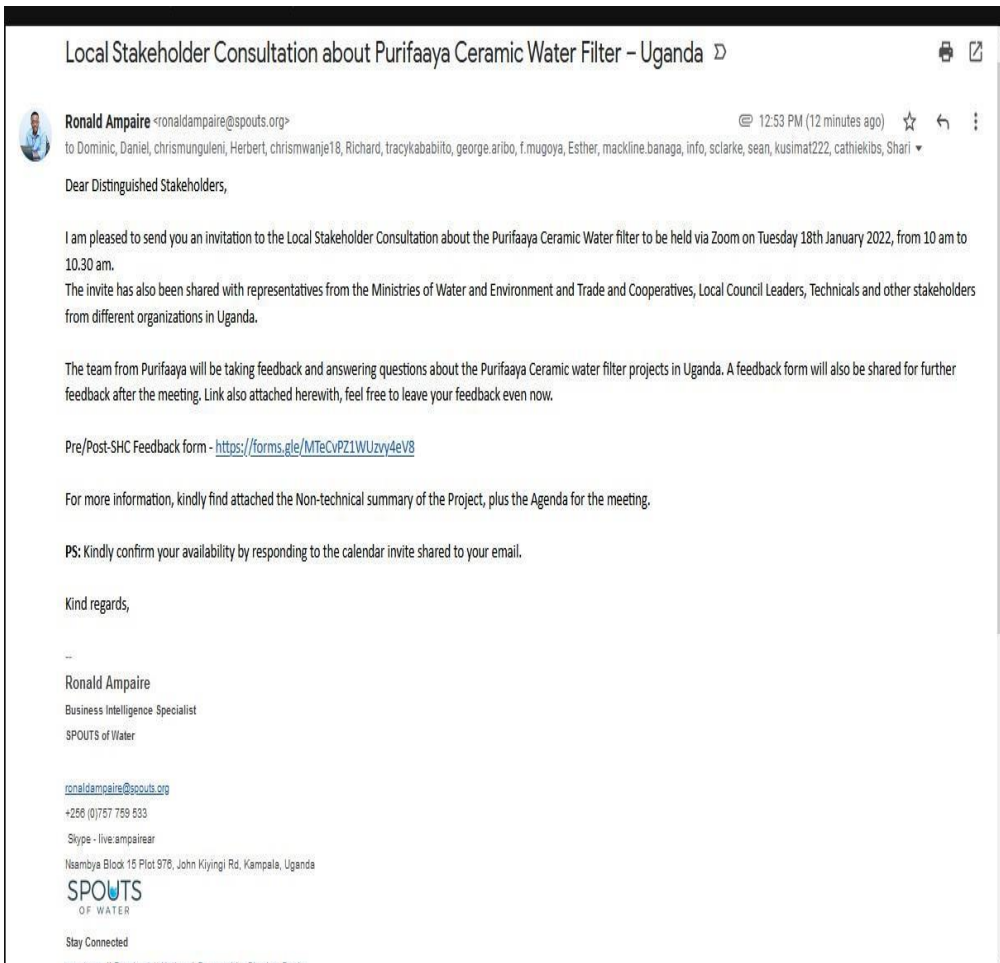
### B.1.2. Gender Sensitivity



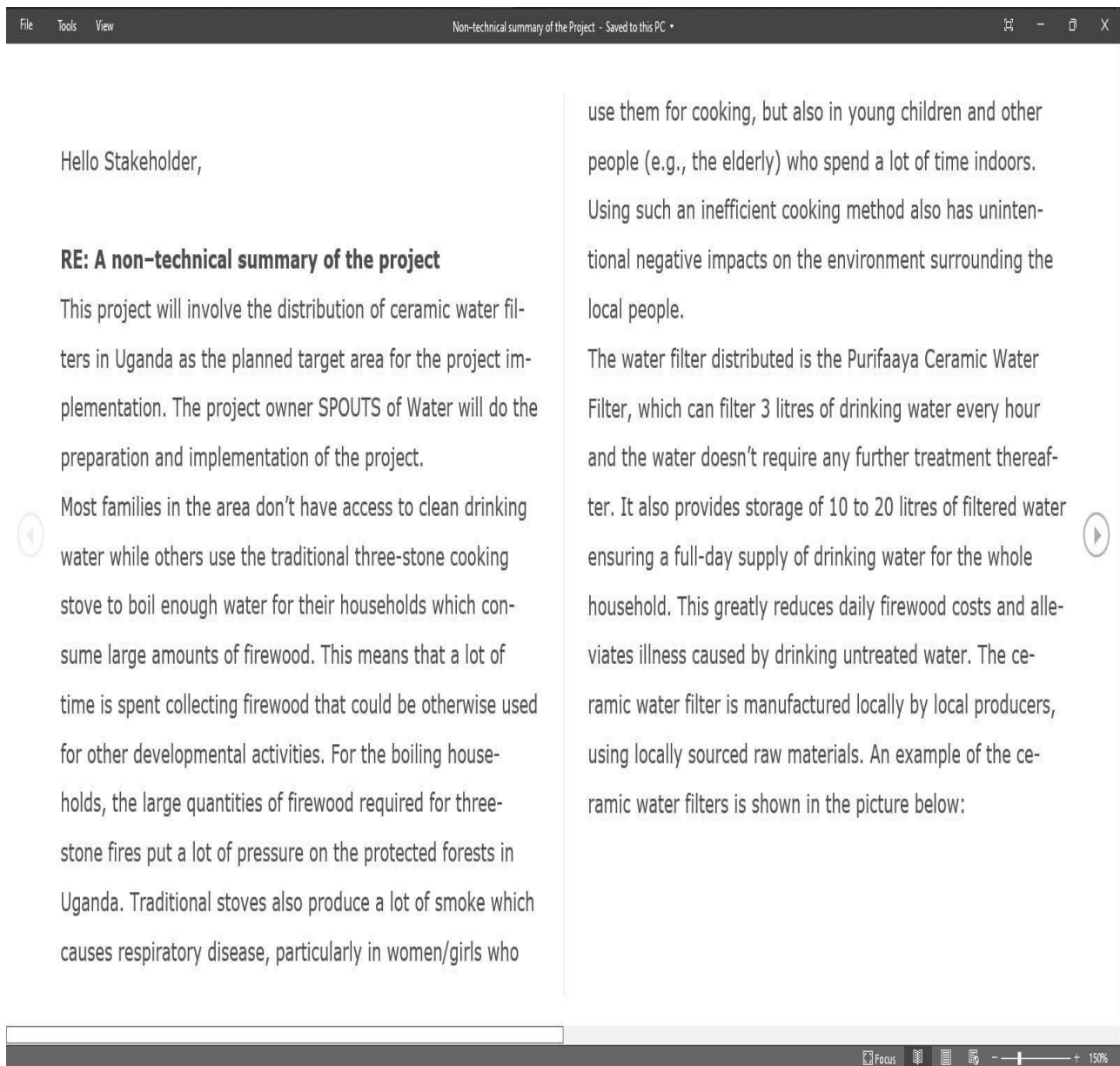

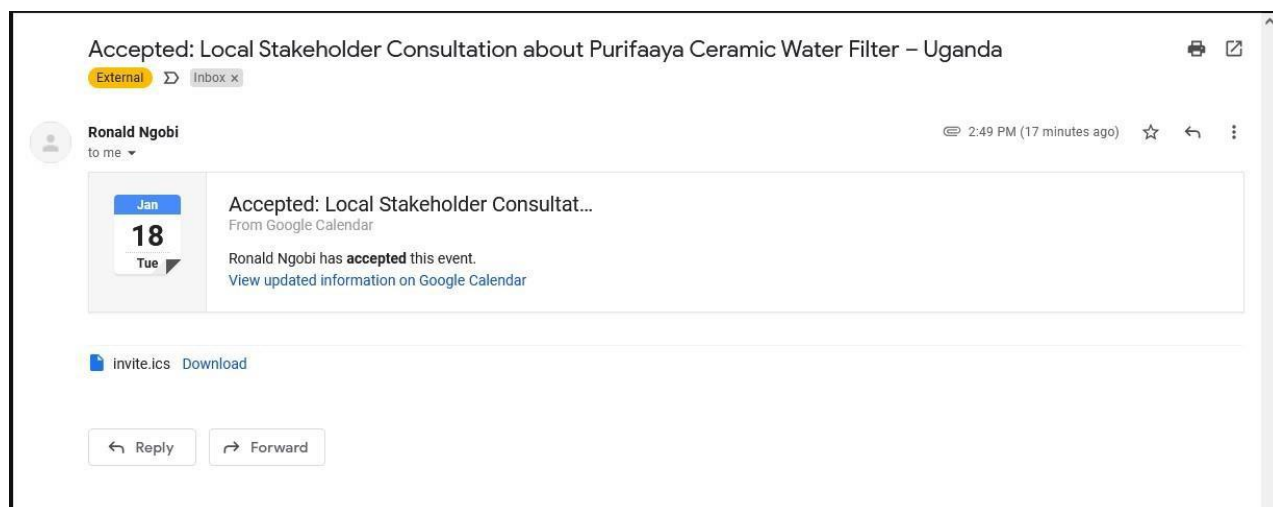

1. Opening meeting

The meeting started as scheduled at 10.00 am on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2022 via Zoom [link](#). The Agenda has earlier been shared with participants when sending invitations.

The meeting was moderated by Ronald Ampaire who asked every member to do a quick round of introductions, in their different capacities. After the introductions, he thanked every participant present for showing up at such short notice.

Daniel, the Project Manager also appreciated every participant for being present at such notice and encouraged each to share feedback and questions regarding Purifaaya projects.

Ronald, the moderator went further to introduce the purpose of the meeting and ran through the Agenda once more to make sure all items are handled one by one. Ronald also emphasized that the meeting has been held virtually due to the Covid-19 Restrictions in Uganda and for safety reasons, other participants, we consulted person to person.

## 2. Presentation of the non-technical summary

Ronald briefly ran through the summary of the project with emphasis on what has been achieved since Purifaaya was introduced on the market which included;

- Reduced pressure on protected forests in Uganda, deforestation and degradation of surrounding forests, as less wood will be needed, just to prepare home meals, not drinking water;
- Reduced soil erosion and nutrient loss as trees protect the land;
- Reduced risk of flooding in hilly areas as trees and plants on slopes soak up the rain;
- Reduced poverty, as there a reduction on annual expenditure on cooking fuel;
- Provision of employment opportunities to the locals who are employed at the factory, offices and field projects;
- Reduced adverse health effects associated with drinking untreated water and smoke inhalation;
- Reduced cooking and wood collection time, which will allow more time to be spent on other important household tasks and/or supervising children;

Ronald went further to discuss the 3 Sustainable Development Goals which have been checked through the dissemination of the Purifaaya Water Filter which includes;

- SDG 6 – Clean Water and Sanitation
  - Through the use of the Purifaaya, households have access to clean and safe drinking water. This means the risk of waterborne illnesses has been reduced.
- SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production
  - Through the use of the water filters, households are spending less on purchasing fuel, only buying that for making food. More money is saved and invested into education for children, and other businesses to generate more income for the family
  - Through the production of the water filters, employment opportunities have been created and locals' standards of living are improved by earning salaries at SPOUTS.
- SDG 13 – Climate Action

- Through the dissemination of water filters, there's no need for households to continue boiling drinking water. This means less wood will be consumed, which leads to a reduction of GHG emissions, contributing to SDG 13.

Less wood needed to only prepare meals in the households will also positively lead to:

- Reduced pressure on the Forests in Uganda;
- Reduced soil erosion and nutrient loss as trees protect the land;
- Reduced risk of flooding in hilly areas as trees and plants on slopes soak up rain.

### 3. Impact (economic, social and environmental) of the project moving forward

- The Project is open for all households which previously boiled water a method to make water safe for consumption and also those that have completely no access to clean and safe drinking water.
- The Project shall not discriminate with regards to equal treatment, or lead to adverse impact on gender equality or the situation of women.  
Both men and women will be allowed equal opportunities to take part in the project.
- The Project shall not increase health risks. It will reduce health risks associated with drinking untreated water by providing a consistent source of drinking water and through the improvement of indoor air pollution.
- The project shall not hurt the economic situation of the community. The positive impact shall however include; the product will be produced locally, using local resources when installation begins.
- Finally, the project will contribute to 3 SDGs during and after implementation. SDG 6 – Clean Water and Sanitation, SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production and SDG 13 – Climate Action.

### 4. Question from Stakeholders

Ronald welcomed questions from the Stakeholders and they were as follows;

- **RONALD NGOBI – WASH MANAGER - VIVA CON AGUA**

Appreciated the presentation and went further to share an observation. **Observation/QN:** Was the choice of the title of the document, Non-technical summary deliberate to avoid statistics, because essentially what you're talking about is key but doesn't make sense when it is not substantiated, is not backed up by statistics. So I don't know whether that was deliberate. For instance, if you're talking about reduced poverty. As a stakeholder, I would be interested in knowing how much contribution you have made to that extent. You're talking about clean water and sanitation and you're talking about people accessing water daily, and you know that UN, WHO, and the rest have categorised or come up with indicators and targets. So one would be interested, which of the targets or indicators is SPOUTS contributing to. Because I don't think you're everywhere within Goal 6, which target are you particularly contributing to. Are you talking about community participation! Issue of evidence is really key and would be good to have some statistics to inform what we're talking about. The evidence out there can really make a lot of sense.

**Daniel – Reply 1:** We're doing this for the Gold Standard and as mentioned earlier, the GS process is very thorough.
